Beach Competition / Match Secretary's Report 2021 – 2022

It's that time to reflect back on the season, with a couple of new matches and some old favourites. New this season was the species match fished at Lowestoft Pier. I felt this was very successful, not only due to the fact that I won it with seven species, eel, bass, sand smelt, wrasse, sea scorpion, rock goby and a pout, but second place was Andy Metcalf with six species for 167 points and with Bob Foster also with six species for 165 points so a very close match. There was 136 Pouting recorded with Scott Lewin catching 29 Pouting.

The Turner Shield was won by Bob Foster fishing in the Butts on a hard evening, which again was close and young Kelsey Creasy was leading the match until about 30 minutes from the end. She did retain 3rd place which was a good achievement. The Christmas match was rearranged till after Christmas and was won by Bruce Lawrence. Mark Banham won the juniors. Easter Fayre match, what a red-letter day for 13-year-old Mark Banham, not only did he win the juniors but with 619 points made up of dogfish, whiting and a nice ray, won overall. He also beat Mark Ward in KO cup and Mark Ward came 2nd in the Easter match.

Tuesday Evening cup was won by a very informed Dale Pegg winning it with 30 points and runner up was Cameron Turner with 29 points.
